Let's Practice!

- Have your child greet you according to the correct time of the day. The students should say, "Buenos días" when they wake up, "Buenas tardes" when they are picked up from school, and "Buenas noches" before they go to bed.
- Ask your child how he/she is feeling. The students should respond in Spanish with "bien" if they are well, "así, así" if they are okay, and "mal" if they are not well.
